#### **MISSION**

Create an inclusive environment that empowers all individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities by enhancing their abilities through various therapeutic activities, care and equal opportunities for a dignified life.

#### **ABOUT SANDESH**

Sandesh is a community which aims at bringing happiness into the lives of all, especially the most vulnerable within our society. We measure HQ rather than IQ. Individuals are supported by imparting the feeling of belonging and self-dignity which empowers growth to the fullest potential.

Sandesh became registered as a Charitable Trust on May 30, 2008. We are registered under the Disability Act 1995. Sandesh maintains 80G, 12A (income tax exemption) and the FCRA certificate.

Support is provided through friendships and well-wishers who have become part of the Sandesh family by spending time, providing provision, assisting in the vocational unit and celebrating special days in-house. We are fortunate to have professionals who share their skills with our community members, and in return, are affected on a deep level through their service work.

Many of our members come from lower socio-economic backgrounds. Behaviours can also be challenging. We have consciously made a decision that Sandesh support the care, therapies and training of our members who have been diagnosed with mental disability (mild, moderate, severe and profound), Down's Syndrome, Cerebral Palsy and Autism. Throughout its' twelve year history, Sandesh has reached over 300 families and this has only been possible with your support.

UTSAV provides specialized therapies, personal care training and exercises for members with severe and profound disabilities to holistically support their emotional, mental and physical growth. It also provides Functional Academics to children in the age group of 6-14 years with mild disability.

Counselling for parents is a key component of Sandesh and functions as a support system for parents and families. Its supports their role as primary caregivers through training and building awareness. It also helps them share their views, fears and anxiety with other caregivers in a trusted and friendly environment, where they can support each other emotionally.





#### **EARLY INTERVENTION CARE**

This program works with children in the age group of 0-6 years to help identify intellectual and developmental disability at an early stage and provide timely diagnosis and treatment support. Through early intervention, we help minimize the disability and avoid further complications. We hope to resume this unit more actively in the coming years.

#### CARE AND THERAPY CENTRE

This centre provides specialised therapies, personal care training and exercises for members with severe and profound disabilities to holistically support their emotional, mental and physical growth. The Care and Therapy Centre also provides functional academics to children in the age group of 6-14 years.



#### WORK UNIT: PRE-VOCATIONAL UNIT

All activities in this unit are focused on supporting skill development that can prepare the members for training in the Sheltered Workshop. It supports members in the age group of 14-18 years. To date, all of our members from the Pre-Vocational Unit have successfully transitioned to the Sheltered Workshop.



#### WORK UNIT: SHELETERED WORKSHOP

Training within this unit is for members of ages 18 and above and it includes skill development, work discipline and preparation/coping strategies for employment in an inclusive work environment. Members create lamp shades, note books, greeting cards, candles and many other salable products which are sold in the market at competitive prices and profits are invested back into Sandesh to support the members. Members earn a small monthly stipend in exchange for their hard work.


